London

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Jidori » 🍷🍷🍷 (89 Kingsland High Street, E8 +44 20 7686 5634) This east end riff on a Tokyo yakitori joint is a perfect fit for hipper-than-thou Dalston: seriously good Japanese BBQ chicken in a pared-back canteen space, with awesome craft cocktails and skinny jeans aplenty.
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Zia Lucia » 🍷🍷🍷 (157 Holloway Road, +20 7700 3708) Head here when you need to step up your pizza game. Choose from a charcoal, wholemeal, gluten-free or traditional base and go for the dreamlike Arianna with sausage, goats cheese and truffle honey. Indecently good.
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Brixton Rum Kitchen » (443-445 Coldharbour Lane) So much more than a rum shack, this third arm of the popular Caribbean eatery feels more like a house party, thanks to the warm welcome and DJ on the decks. Demolish the rum menu and get ready to jerk, jerk, jerk.
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Dinner at the Twits » You're invited to the most revolting dinner party on earth to taste Mrs Twit's gruesome bird pie and boozy punch (watch out for glass eyes in your drink). Squeamish? Stayaway. Until 30 October. twitsdinner.com

Edinburgh

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Badger & Co. » 🍷🍷🍷 (32 Castle Street, +44 13 1226 5430) This all-day bar and bistro champions sustainable, seasonal and nose-to-tail dishes that are made impress: think bacon-wrapped scallops, lamb with parmesan polenta, a whole roasted suckling pig and chocolate-orange cheesecake.
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Wahaca » 🍷🍷🍷 (16 South Andrew Street) London's favourite Mexican street-food chain finally opens its first doors in Scotland on 10 October, to cook up tacos, taquitos and toscadas amid colourful décor that's sure to liven up Edinburgh's east end. Arriba!
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Leith Depot » (138-140 Leith Walk) Part bar, part live-music venue, it's as if a slice of Williamsburg has been transported to Edinburgh, complete with exposed brick walls and old bus seats for chairs. The inspired bar snacks keep the crowd going all night – beer-battered pickles, anyone?
